




“FISH TALES”



CHARTER MASTER'S REPORT

This year's fishing schedule is up on the web-site and on every newsletter. A big thank you to our new webmaster, Luis, for the quick response in getting it posted. All of the charters through June and the big one in November are open. July through October will open at the February club meeting.

There was an e-mail that went out and I have been asked about the Vagabond trip. The Vagabond is a side trip, and as with all side trips, it's not a club charter, you must contact John DeWitt directly.

At this point I am going to open all the charters through the end of June and the one in November to family and friends, we need to get these charters filled please. The March charter should be an outstanding trip, we are schedule to go up and out to San Nicholas Island. The May charter to San Clemente Island will try for White Sea Bass in the morning and then Yellow Tail, if not we will fish for bottom fish.

At the December meeting when our guest speaker talked about La Bocana there were many that said they were interested and wanted to go. Well I have 7 open spots for that trip, it is set for November 2nd thru November 7th the cost is \$1925, plus fish cleaning, tips, dinners, alcoholic beverages, parking and crossing fee to the Tijuana airport, fishing gear & tackle if you don't want to take your own. You must, sign up by contacting Jim Mauritz 760-450-7060, commit & get your \$600 deposit in by the March Club meeting. All deposit will made out to OSA. Once we have all 12 deposits then we will send them in. If I don't get 12 signups then I will cancel this trip before we send in the deposits. If you send in your deposit directly to the company, you will be taking a risk of losing it.

Let's take a quick look at the club rules about signing up. Once you have signed up that is the time you select your bunk. The Charter Master has the right to replace you if you are not fully paid within seven days. Once you have paid, there are no refunds. You are responsible to find your own replacement, the Charter Master will provide you with names of alternates if he has any. I will send out an e-mail for you once the charter is filled. If you sign up a friend on our charters you are responsible that that person including their behavior. All guest must be at least eighteen (18) years of age. We have a charter set for August 1, for members to bring the younger guest.

If you have any questions please feel free to give me a call. I hope to see many more you out with the club fishing, we are a fishing club.

CONSERVATION

The end of 2018 was exciting as President Trump signed the Modern Fish Act in to law on Dec 31st. But as we were celebrating this victory for recreational fishing, Secretary of Interior Ryan Zinke retired. He was a supporter of recreational fishing and helped us his first day in office by getting rid of the National Marine Monument proposal for Tanner and Cortez Banks thus saving some extremely productive fishing grounds. The Fish & Game Commission adopted revised Mission and Vision statements and core values.

The start of 2019 brings changes in groundfish. The new depth restriction is 75 fathoms or 450 feet. Lingcod limit decreases to 1 fish per person. California Scorpionfish are open year-round with a limit of 5 per person. Depth restriction in the Cowcod Conservation Area is now 40 fathoms. We are looking forward to authorizing the Sheepshead file length this year by the Fish & Game Commission.

For those who also fish fresh water, CDFW is working on a simplification process on trout regulations by streamlining the number of seasons as well as take and size restrictions. They are working to hold townhall meetings this spring throughout the state. We are trying to get them to hold some of the sessions at the Fred Hall Shows.




